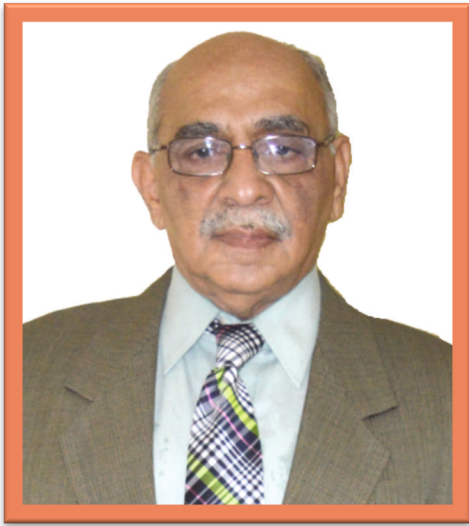

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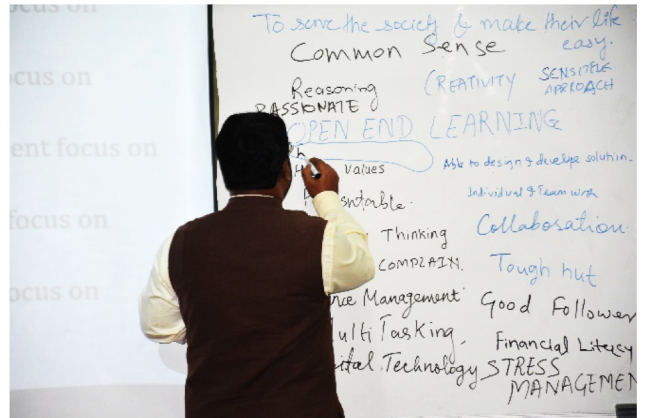

TWO DAYS ISTE APPROVED WORKSHOP ON “STEPPING TOWARDS PROBLEM AND PROJECT BASED LEARNING”

Centre For Innovative Teaching & Exuberant Learning (CiTeL) under IQAC initiative has organised a two day ISTE Approved Workshop on “STEPPING TOWARDS PROBLEM AND PROJECT BASED LEARNING” on 5th and 6th March 2021.

The program was conducted for the faculty members of school of Engineering and Technology, School of Pharmacy, School of Architecture of AIKTC and Abdul Razzak Kalsekar Polytechnic. Fifty seven faculty members have participated in the workshop and enriched their knowledge and skills in problem and project based learning. Resource person at the workshop was **Dr Vikas Shinde, Director, Centre of Excellence in Project Based Learning (PBL), Vishwaniketan iMEET, Khalapur.**



WORKSHOP ON “STEPPING TOWARDS PROBLEM AND PROJECT BASED LEARNING”

Main objective of this workshop was to bring together educators from academia and understand the need for use of PBL as an innovative pedagogy in teaching and learning; its relevance to outcome based education (OBE) and Bloom's Taxonomy and improved practical approach towards implementation of problems and project based learning. **Dr. Vikas Shinde** discussed principles and philosophy of PBL curriculum through active exercises and team activities. The highlight of the workshop was identification of real-life problems to include in the curriculum through hands-on exercises like poster design, workbooks and team discussions. The Workshop received a quite positive response from the participating faculties. This workshop was convened by **Asst Prof. Shaikh Abusufyan, Controller, CiTeL** and Coordinated by **Asst Prof. Geeta Desai, CiTeL Coordinator, SoET-EXTC Department**.



A VIRTUAL WORKSHOP ON “INNOVATIVE METHODS OF ACTIVE LEARNING TO ENHANCE STUDENTS’ CLASS ENGAGEMENT AND LEARNING OUTCOMES”

In line with this, a virtual workshop on Innovative methods of active learning to enhance students class engagement and learning outcome was organized on 19th November 2020. **Dr. Mohamad Farooq Shaikh, Associate Professor, Monash University Malaysia, Dr. Arshad Salema, Senior Lecturer, Monash**

University Malaysia, Dr. Mohammad Tahir Ansari, Associate Professor, School of Pharmacy, University Of Nottingham and Dr. Nafees Ahemad, Senior Lecturer, Monash University Malaysia were the resource person for this workshop.

The workshop began with opening remark about the workshop by **Dr. Abdul Razak Honnutagi, Director AIKTC**. A webinar "YouTube Made Easy for Teaching & Learning"

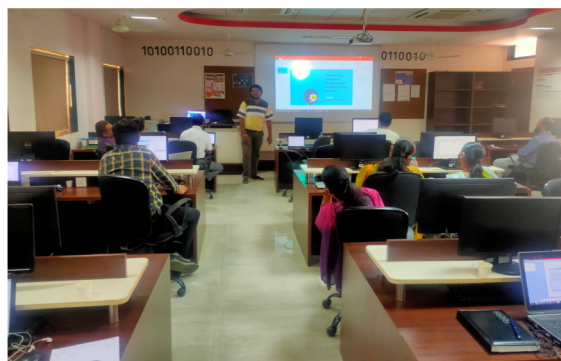

This webinar was coordinated by **Asst Prof. Taib Quraishi** as a part of TTTs initiative of the CiTeL.

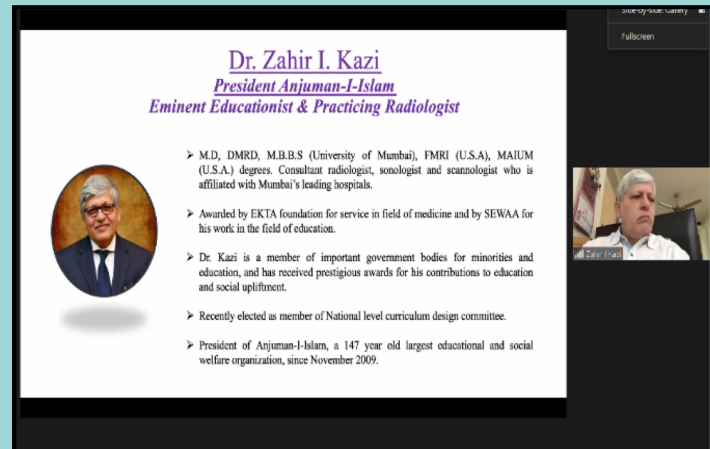
Online Programme on NEP 2020: Impact on Higher Education” as a part of AICTE/ISTE Sponsored Refresher Program

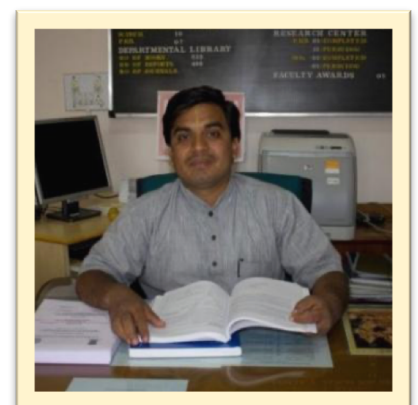
Keynote address III : “Role of Teacher in Research & Innovation”

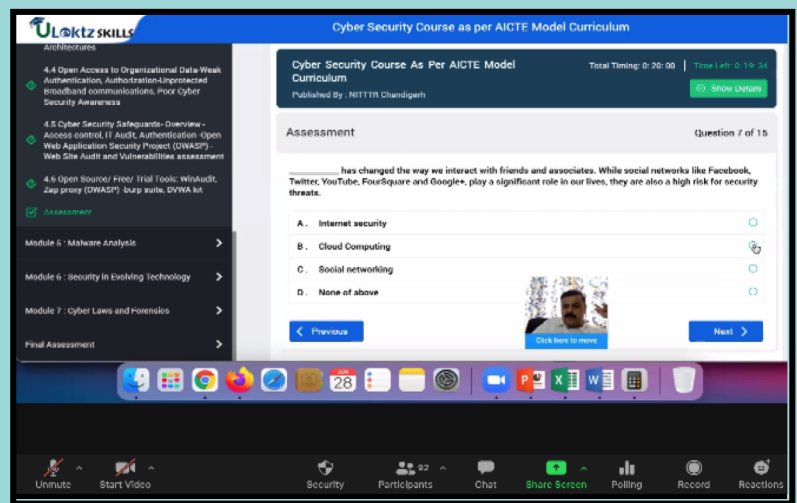
Keynote address V: “Developing Own MOOCs”

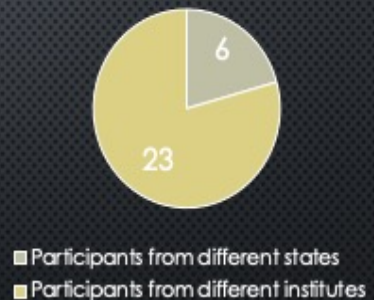

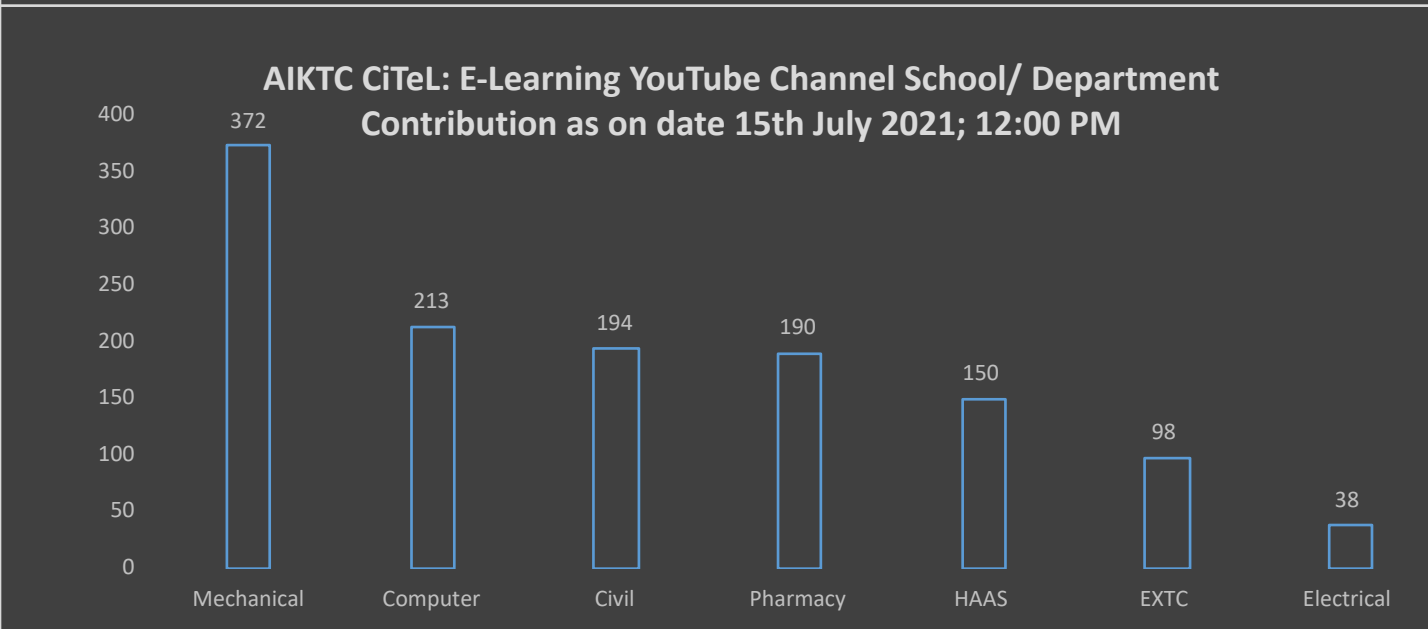
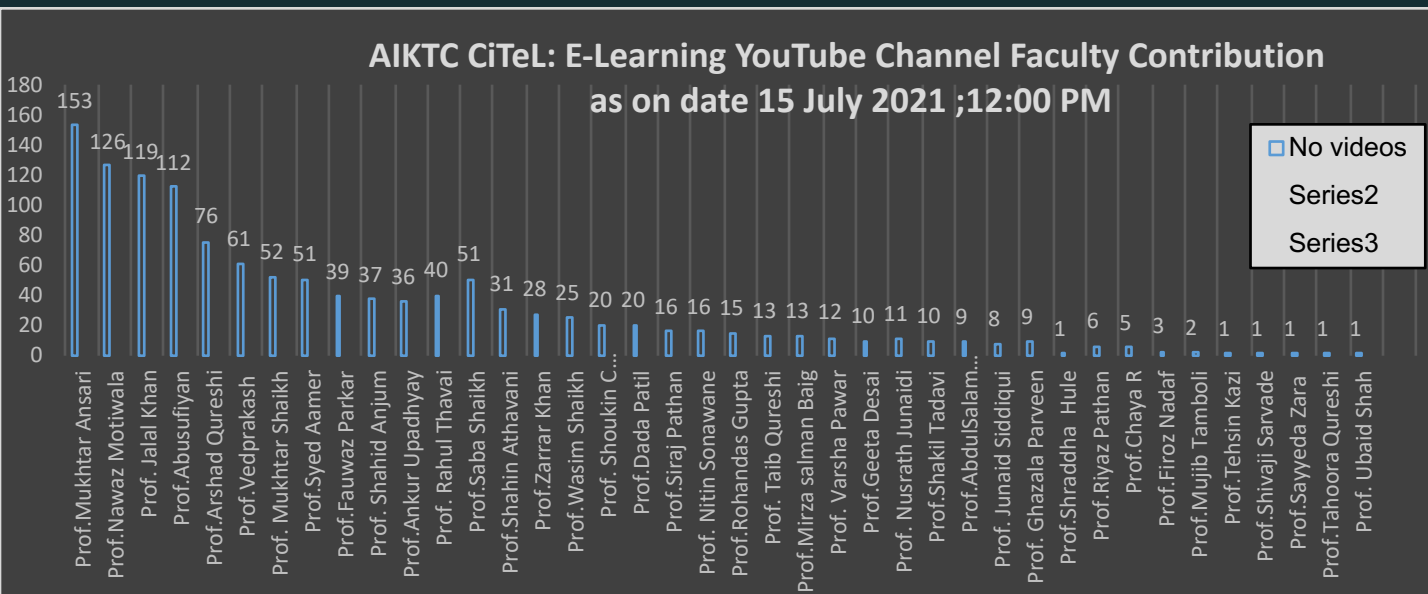

With COVID-19 pandemic there is immense increase in the demand for E-learning content.
